Q10. People who receive and sell an inherited gift are subject to a capital gains tax. Under current law, this tax is based on the increased value of the gifts (homes, businesses, equipment, or land) from when they are inherited to when those gifts are sold. A new proposal called the STEP Act would treat inheritance as a transfer (like a sale) rather than a gift, transforming death into a taxable event. The tax would be assessed immediately upon receipt of the inherited gifts - rather than when they are eventually sold.

The additional capital gains tax from the STEP Act would be calculated based on the increased gift value from the time the deceased person first obtained them to the point they're transferred to the beneficiary. This tax would be additional to the current capital gains taxes on the increased value of the gifts at the time they're potentially sold.

This tax applies to increases in gift value of over \$1 million. And there is a 15 year deferment option that would allow the tax to be paid in installments rather than in one lump sum.

Q20. Here is a real-world example of how the STEP Act might function:

Maria built a carpet cleaning business from the ground up that employs 30 people and is worth around \$2.5 million, taking into account all of the equipment that's required to run the business like vacuums, cleaners, and vans.

When Maria passes the business and its equipment to her children who want to continue her business, they will receive an immediate capital gains tax of up to a 40% (the proposed capital gains tax rate) on \$1.5 million (taking the \$1million exemption into account). That means a tax bill of around \$600,000 - more than Maria makes in 6 years.

Even if her children choose to defer payment, they will still owe an extra \$40,000 every year for the next 15 years. Because all of the company's extra capital is invested in equipment, Maria's children will need to either take out expensive loans, fire employees, or sell some of the company's vans to free up the cash to pay the tax.

Despite the business being worth \$2.5 million, Maria considers herself middle class because she only takes home around \$75,000 per year.
